COURAGEOUS KARLI

Karli Fourie from Melkbosstrand, 30km north of Cape Town, planned to swim from Robben Island to Blouberg beach, aiming to become the youngest person to do so.

Three years ago, Karli and her family climbed up Table Mountain via Platteklip Gorge in support of charities through the JDI Cableway Charity Challenge. It was during this climb that the idea to help orphaned and abandoned children was born. She spoke to Peter Marx and learned about the many children who no longer had biological parents to care for them.

"I felt heartsore for these children and wanted to help Home from Home make a difference," said a softly spoken Karli. Shortly thereafter, Karli packed a parcel of her clothing to donate to us and continued to do it every year on her birthday.

This year, Karli's dream was to combine her clothing donations with raising funds for Home from Home by swimming the Robben Island crossing (7.4km).

On the morning of 23 August, Karli turned her dream into reality. This phenomenal young girl successfully completed the crossing, and officially became the youngest person to swim the Robben Island Crossing! She was accompanied by family friend, Howard Warrington an experienced open water swimmer and world record holder for having swum the famous crossing more than 200 times.

In addition to her amazing swimming achievement, Karli raised over R50 000 for Home from Home. Her determination to achieve this goal was remarkable. She was motivated and committed to the training (5km per training session, four times a week) to meet this challenge and make a difference in the lives of foster children.

These are the actions that change the world for the better!

FOSTER MOTHER WELLNESS DAY

Our dedicated foster mothers play a crucial role in providing essential care to their foster children. They are the key to the success of our care model, creating a sense of family within this non-biologically linked group. Each parent is expected to unconditionally love all the children in their care, fostering an environment where everyone feels like part of a family—siblings and parents alike. This strong foundation of belonging empowers the children to overcome past vulnerabilities and embrace positive opportunities in society.

Our foster mothers tirelessly create loving family homes around the clock. To express our immense gratitude, we arranged a wellness day for them. On 29 July, our foster mothers gathered at Christ Church in Kenilworth for their annual wellness event. The day kicked off with warm coffee and muffins. Next, they attended a financial wellness presentation facilitated by Old Mutual. Health checks, conducted by local nurses, followed, along with indulgent treats like hot chocolate and head, neck, and shoulder massages.

MZI'S INSPIRING JOURNEY

On 19 December 2011, nine-year-old Mzi was admitted to Home from Home's care and placed with Foster Mother Beauty's Loving Family in Masiphumelele. Mzi and his siblings were removed from their parents' care due to severe neglect, as they were left unsupervised for long periods of time. Initially placed in a safety home, they were later transferred to Home from Home.

Mzi is generally a quiet young man who enjoys his own company, but engaging with him quickly reveals his great sense of humour! As he grew up, Mzi showcased his talent and passion for soccer. However, in 2021, challenges arose in the foster home, leading to his move to Baphumelele. Home from Home has a partnership with Baphumelele, working together to support vulnerable children and youth.

Fast forward to today, Mzi is now staying at our Khayelitsha Transition Support Home. Recently, he was appointed as the house leader, reflecting his growth and leadership qualities. Our Transition Support Team has great faith in his ability to guide the young men in the house and help them uplift one another.

Currently, Mzi is undertaking a one-year learnership in our Head Office as part of the Operations Team. We are incredibly proud of how far he has come despite his challenging start and look forward to seeing what else he will achieve as we continue to support him.
